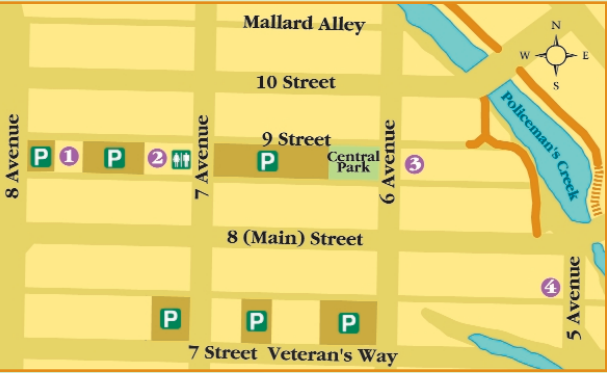
The Town of Canmore

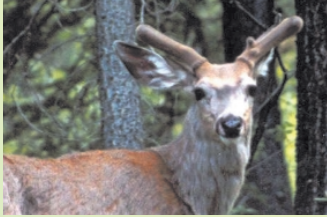

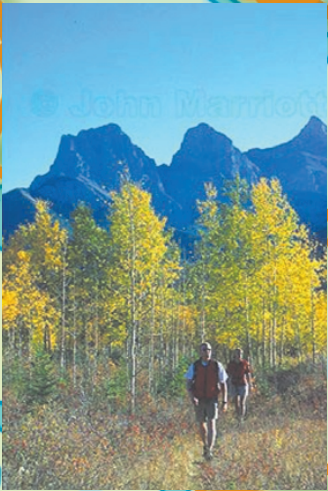
Please help us to keep our town clean by:

Safety

When hiking be sure to have weather proof clothing, sturdy footwear, water and other essential items. Also, let someone know where you are going and when they should expect you back.
- ▲ Report any bear or cougar sightings to Fish and Wildlife.
- ▲ Bicyclists under the age of 17 must wear a bike helmet.
- ▲ Pedestrians, equestrians and cyclists share many of the trails. Please be courteous and make your presence known with a bell or a friendly greeting.

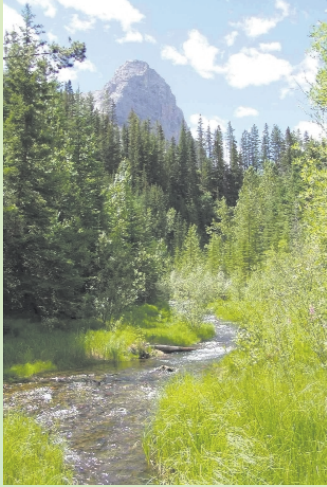
